

Pet-Proofing Checklist

How to makeyour home safe for pets





Secure your trash cans

Invest in a trash can with a locking lid or keep the bin inside a closet or cabinet with a child-safety lock.

Secure cleaning supplies

Keep household cleaning products out of reach in a locked cabinet. Consider non-toxic and pet safe options.

Store medications safely

Store medications in high cabinets out of your pet's reach. Use child-proof latches for especially curious and persistent pets.

Protect from electrical hazards

To prevent pets from chewing on electrical cords or licking outlets, keep them hidden or invest in outlet covers.

Hang up handbags and backpacks

Purses and backpacks may contain items that are toxic to pets, so always place them in a safe location.

Beware of toxic foods

Keep toxic foods, such as chocolate, items that contain xylitol, grapes, onions, and garlic, away from your pet.

Make your décor pet-friendly

Secure lamps, bookshelves, and decorations your pet can pull or knock down. Move open storage to a closed closet or a high shelf.

Avoid toxic plants

Keep toxic plants and cut flowers out of reach of pets or avoid them entirely. Remove potentially dangerous plants from your yard.

Safeguard the garage

Lock up pesticides, fertilizer, antifreeze, and any other chemicals that can be fatal to pets. Clean up spills. Store sharp tools out of reach.

Maintain your yard

Trim back tall grasses and remove debris to keep ticks at bay. Routinely clean backyard structures to prevent fleas from congregating.

Fence in your pool area

Never leave your pet unattended in a yard with a pool.

Check fence for weak areas

Pets can slip through tiny gaps and holes in a fence. Perform regular checks to ensure your yard is secure.

Post emergency numbers

Keep animal poison control hotline and veterinarian phone numbers close by in case of emergency.
